Upcoming Pajama Parties: The main aim of these parties is to raise money which will allow Malaria No More to send bed-nets to those at risk from malaria. Student leaders are holding these parties in sorority and fraternity houses, in campus common rooms, and in apartments! Each party starts with the screening of a new, twenty-minute documentary by the United Nations on Malaria. Then, there's a brief discussion of the documentary and the party opens up with fun and music featuring the Children of Agape in South Africa. Pajama parties are coming up everywhere from New York City and Washington, D.C., to Lagos, Nigeria.
